ELECTRONIC DEVICES (OPTIONAL)

Saltwater P-9 College operates as a one-to-one device school. Apple iPads are used in Prep to Year 3, and Apple MacBook Airs are used in Years 4 to Year 9. These devices are an integral part of our curriculum and are used to enhance student learning. Devices can be purchased through JB Hi-Fi, or families may bring their own Apple device to be loaded with the school's application image.

Please note: This is not a compulsory item. The school has classroom devices available for students who do not have their own. These devices will be shared within the classroom and must remain on school premises.

IMPORTANT UPDATE – BYOD CHANGES FROM 2027

From 2027, the Department of Education will no longer permit primary schools (Prep to Grade 6) to invite families to provide their own digital devices (iPads/laptops). Schools will instead be required to supply class sets of devices, with new recommended screen-time limits also coming into effect. Our school will continue with our current BYOD program until then, while ensuring it aligns with the Department's guidelines. Further information will be shared with families in 2026 detailing what the screen-time limits will look like for each year level from the 2027 school year and beyond.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Camps Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)

Is available for eligible families. Upon request application forms will be sent out at the start of 2026 for new families or newly eligible families. Parents who currently receive the CSEF and who remain eligible will automatically have their application renewed. However, should there be additional students starting (e.g. Prep student) a new application form will be required.

REFUNDS

Saltwater P-9 College believes that the Camps, Excursion and Incursion program is highly beneficial for students and provides opportunities for particular learning experiences that cannot be gained in the classroom. Saltwater College encourages all students to participate in these activities. There will be occasions when a student needs to withdraw from an activity after they have made payment.

Q&A – CHANGES TO BOYD 2027

Q. Is it worth purchasing a device now if the BYOD program ends in 2027?

A. No. From 2027, schools will provide devices for all students, so there's no need to purchase a new one now.

Q. What are the new screen-time limits, and how will they affect my child's learning?

A. Our updated approach focuses on *balanced* technology use. Screen-time will be purposefully integrated to enhance learning, with more emphasis on hands-on, collaborative, and outdoor activities. Specific classroom guidelines will be shared as part of our digital wellbeing framework.

Q: What are the new recommended digital device usage times for schools starting in 2027?

A: From 2027, schools should follow new guidelines that recommend minimal device time for students in Prep to Year 3, and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for students in Years 4 to 6.

Q: Which devices will students use under these new guidelines?

A: Prep - Year 6: iPad Year 7 – Year 9: MacBooks

Q: Will school-provided devices be sufficient for all students after 2027?

A: Yes. From 2027 onwards, the school will provide devices to ensure student have access to technology that supports their learning needs, when required.

Q. Can we still use our own device after 2027, or will it be banned?

A: After 2027, the school-provided devices will be the standard for all students. Personally owned devices will not be permitted for learning activities at school.

Q: How will the school manage shared devices to ensure hygiene and fairness?

A: Any shared use of devices will be cleaned regularly, and fair access procedures will be in place.

Q. What happens if we don't purchase a device now? Will my child miss out on learning opportunities?

A. Your child will not miss out. We will ensure that we have enough devices to support student learning.

Q. When and how will we receive more information about the 2027 changes?

A. We'll provide regular updates through newsletters, parent information sessions, and the school website. A detailed communication outlining the transition timeline and logistics will be shared in 2026.





Q: Can my child keep using their iPad instead of purchasing a new MacBook Air for Year 4?

A: Yes.

How to attend?

To attend our program, you must first enrol your child.

Once enrolment is complete, you can then make a booking to secure a spot in advance for your child. Follow these 3 simple steps:

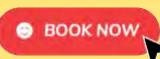
Preparing for Enrolment:

Please have the required documents and info. ready to ensure a smooth enrolment experience:

- ✓ Current immunisation record from Medicare or the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)
- ✓ Any medical documents (such as an action plan signed by a doctor if your child has asthma, allergies, anaphylaxis or any medical condition)
- ✓ Any documentation relating to parenting plans, custodial orders etc.
- ✓ Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) of: 1) parent/guardian and 2) child
- ✓ Access to MyGov
- ✓ Have your payment details ready



2. Book:



a) Book online using the online booking system.

OR

a) By Scanning the QR Code above.

3. Apply for Child Care Subsidy



Scan QR code or call Services Australia on 13 61 50 between 9am and 5pm (local time) weekdays to apply. *You must confirm Big Childcare as your service provider on your MyGov account.

If you already have an existing account with Big Childcare



All you will need to do is book in using the online portal system.

Family Handbook:



Scan or click QR code to download the important information you need to know before attending our program.

Permanent Bookings:

For children who use the service on a weekly basis, permanent booking are considered to be at least one session per week for an entire term or more.

Casual Bookings:

A casual booking is a one-off booking that occurs occasionally and is not part of the permanent booking schedule for that child.

Casual bookings can be made online on our online booking system.

Cancellations:

Bookings can be cancelled up to 48 hours prior to the session without incurring a session fee. For cancellations within 48 hours of the session, you will be charged the full fee, less any Child Care Subsidy you are entitled to, unless you are able to provide a medical certificate.

Child Safety

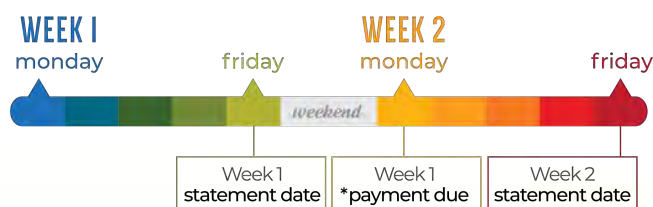
Payment

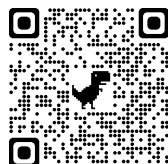
